PLANS 3 CLASSIC FISHING TOURNAMENTS
FOR THE 2005 SEASON

The Nantucket Anglers' Club began in 1969 when a group of local fishermen formed a multi-purposed association: to promote fresh and saltwater angling from both boat and beach; to foster and conduct fishing tournaments of all kinds' to promote and encourage conservation of marine fisheries and the preservation and maintenance of beaches, marshland, etc.; all for the use and enjoyment of the members of the association.

The 2005 tournament season will feature three classic tournaments:

The Spring Flyfishing Classic, May 21 through May 29;

The Summer Surf Fishing Classic, June 25 through July 3;

The Fall Striped Bass Boat Classic(3rd annual co-sponsored by Contender Boats), August 27 through September 4;

The Nantucket Anglers' Club Tournament Committee plans to offer club privileges to registered guests while participating in any of these tournaments. Committees are working on formats, rules, prizes, promotions, and registrations. Watch for announcements for each individual tournament. The Nantucket Anglers' Club Scholarship Fund, Inc. will be the recipient of all registration fees. Co-sponsorships will be considered for these tournaments.

Encouraging the youth of the island to participate in and enjoy a pastime which can last a lifetime has been, and is, a passion practiced by the Club. The Membership is recognized by the community for its' annual generosity in providing many scholarships to Nantucket High School graduates, especially those who pursue studies in marine related courses. All youth under age sixteen are eligible for prizes and awards all year long, simply by weighing in their catch at the Club's official scales, whether their parents are members or not. In the spring, some members take Boys and Girls Club kids to the ponds for their first fishing experience.
